1. Download the "How To Do Business With the City" Guide

2. Complete the Application

Provide complete information. Do not leave any item blank. If a section does not apply to your firm, indicate this by writing "N/A" or "NOT APPLICABLE".

Note: Businesses applying need only to submit one application for all City of Lake Charles Small Business Opportunities. Businesses should include as many NAICS codes as needed to better determine their business industry. Based on the information contained in the application, the City will determine which, if any, designation shall be awarded to an individual firm.

3. Collect the Supporting Documentation It is important to include the supporting documentation requested. Applications submitted without this documentation cannot be reviewed.
