Public hearing and consideration of the Lake Charles Planning & Zoning Commission's decision to deny a request for a Variance in order to establish a pool hall with an alcohol license within 300' of a Residential Zoning District, within a Business Zoning District, located at 1200 N. Martin Luther King Highway, Suite 400.

Doug Burguieres, Director of Planning, stated this item was deferred to give the applicant an opportunity to show good faith in operating the lounge establishment. He stated this matter was considered by the Planning and Zoning Commission on October 10, 2022 and the request was denied by a vote of 4-1 and was appealed by the applicant, Sven Poullard. Mr. Burguieres stated that appeal vacates the decision of the Commission so you are voting on the request as originally presented.

Sven Poullard, 2210 S. Savannah Lakes, applicant., gave background information on his education and on various parties that were held at the establishment without incident. He stated he was here to ask for a fair chance.

Robert Joubert, 983 N. Berryvine Ln. applicant, gave background information on his education and having been a 20 year member of the LA Army National Guard. He asked to give him a fair chance and allow the variance for alcohol. He stated we will put precautionary measures in place to mitigate a majority of the risk and show that they can be a valuable part of the community.

Mr. Joubert showed a video of a resident who lives in the neighborhood and has no problem with them being open and selling alcohol. He showed another video which shows his front door of the establishment then driving to where Ms. Joseph's home is indicating there should not be a problem because of the distance.

Mr. leyoub stated there were a number of cards from citizens in opposition but they requested to donate their time to Alvin Joseph. Those donating their time were Brandon Antoine, Valerie Guillory, Joan Ceasar, Tezra Francis, Mycah Francis, Anna Williams, Anna Antoine, Elsie Lewis and Juanita Bartie.

Pastor Lannis Joseph, Ebenezer Baptist Church, Cameron, LA, home address 2812 Gov. PBS Pinchback Dr., stated there were children in the neighborhood and spoke against the request to sell alcohol but was in favor of the new business.

Alvin Joseph, 2309 17th St., stated there was an ordinance adopted in 2003 requiring an establishment that sold alcohol could not be within 300ft from a residence. This establishment is zero feet from the residence of his mother's property. He asked the council to do the right thing and not allow alcohol. He is not against new business but is against what happens when you add alcohol. Mr. Joseph presented a petition from the neighbors on Blackwell St. and Grace St. against the request. The petition was made a part of the record.

Mr. Marks stated to give a variance is also the law. He stated if the owners do not follow the rules, we have the right to come back and pull their license. He stated he was in favor of granting the variance.

Ms. August stated she admires the owners of the establishment but she has had problems in her district with this type of variance. The proximity of the business to the residents is not met therefore she has to go by the law so cannot support the variance.

Mr. Geyen stated he has to follow the law and cannot support the variance.

Mr. Harvey stated laws are frequently amended and he feels the establishment should have an opportunity. If there is a problem, the license can be withdrawn.

After comments from the Council members, Mr. Marks recommended amending the request to add the condition that the establishment provide security during peak hours on Fridays and Saturdays.
