

## <u>School begins</u> Tuesday, AUGUST 13

**Remember:** Observe all school zone speed limits, school crossings, and laws that apply to school uses. Most importantly, watch for the kids.

The school zone speed limit is 25 mph between the hours of 7:00 a.m.–9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.– 4:00 p.m. on school days.

## Drivers are required by State law to:

- Yield the right-of-way, by slowing down or stopping for pedestrians crossing a roadway at a crosswalk
- When a school bus is loading or unloading children, you must stop at least 30 feet from either direction
- Observe the "No Right On Red" signs located in school zone intersections

You do not have to stop when a bus is in a loading zone which is completely off of the roadway.

You do not have to stop when the bus is on a separate roadway, such as a roadway divided by a median.
